The Australian & New Zealand Intensive Care Foundation

The Foundation's 2021 Research Grants Program is now open. The foundation will award up to A\$250,000 with one grant of up to A\$100,000 being offered.

The Chair of the Foundation, A/Professor David Gattas has announced the opening of the 2021 Research Grant Program, during the 23rd Annual Meeting on Critical Trials in Intensive Care.

"The Foundation is delighted to announce that the 2021 program will see a total of A\$250,000 being awarded, with one grant award of up to A\$100,000. 2020 marked the 30th Anniversary of the Foundation and since its inception the Foundation has awarded nearly A\$4M to over 100 research projects in Australia and New Zealand."
