The challenges of critical care nursing require a sound knowledge of contemporary professional issues and evidence based clinical practise. Additionally, the demands of the past two years have highlighted the need to maintain the health and wellbeing, sustainability, and resilience of the critical care workforce. The theme of AEM 2022 "Making a splash in critical care" captures these priorities in a program offering a broad range of topics designed to appeal to clinicians across intensive care, coronary care, emergency, and beyond.
