The ACCCN Online Journal Club met for the third time in August to discuss and critique the paper *Impact of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic on critical care healthcare workers' depression, anxiety, and stress levels.* A lively discussion was held examining all aspects of the study, with first author A/Prof Naomi Hammond joining the session to provide unique insights into how the research team conducted an international survey in the first months of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The next session will be held on the 16th of November at 1400hrs to critique the paper *Critical care health* professionals' self-reported needs for wellbeing during the COVID-19 pandemic: A thematic analysis of survey responses. Update on ICF 2022 Grants Round

The Intensive Care Community responded enthusiastically to the ICF's call for Expressions of Interest (EOIs), with 39 EOIs received from nursing, medical and allied health clinician researchers. ICF uses a twostage application process for grants, to reduce the burden for both applicants and reviewers. The EOIs were reviewed by a panel of experienced multidisciplinary critical care researchers with the highest ranked EOIs now being invited to prepare a full application.

Research Projects – Invitation to participate

The association between shift scheduling and burnout, insomnia and wellbeing in critical care nurses

Researchers at Deakin University are seeking registered nurses who currently practice within critical care areas such as Intensive care, Coronary Care, Peri-Operative units, and Emergency departments to participate in a research study. This study aims to explore the association between undertaking quick returns and increased risk of burnout, impaired wellbeing, and fatigue. A quick return can be defined as returning to the next shift in less than 11 hours. This is most evident within the rostering system as completing a Late (2 pm-10 pm) shift and then an Early (7 am-3 pm) shift (Late- Early). However, various shift models can include a quick return. This includes on-call models and potentially, overtime.

This study addresses a significant gap in current literature, as very little research, has been undertaken within an Australian context. The project will enable a better understanding of the factors that impact Critical Care Nurses' wellbeing. The online survey takes approximately 15 minutes to complete. Participation is completely voluntary and anonymous. Participants will have the opportunity to go into a prize draw to win one of four \$50 Coles Myer Group vouchers.
