Code Brown Victoria

As our members would be aware, Victoria has had a Pandemic Code Brown alert activated from midday 19th January 2022, and it is expected to remain in place for four to six weeks. The Code Brown provides a more centralised and coordinated approach to managing the increased number of patients with COVID-19 requiring hospitalisation due to the Omicron COVID-19 variant, severe workforce shortages, and the continued need to treat patients with other urgent emergencies. Already over the last two years, many of the strategies afforded by a Code Brown response have been in place at times (e.g. surge workforce, redeployment and suspension/cancellation of leave).

ACCCN acknowledges the unprecedented calamity that the pandemic years have presented and is extremely proud of all frontline workers, not least our critical care nurses. Your outstanding efforts have diverted catastrophe in the health care system and ensured outstanding healthcare to our population in the face of adversity. We know you are tired.

ACCCN and the Victorian Committee are committed to our continued support and we are working closely with the Victorian ICU NUMs CoP (Community of Practise) to ensure the safest care of our nurses, co-workers and patients as is currently possible and to ensure a rested, stronger, safer, sustainable workforce in the future.

It was a great way to end the year – an informal evening of great food, great company and engaging presentations.







Invitation to participate in a Delphi study
